- \$4,000-This would cover the cost of a used RV for one of our Staff Members, Jared Smith. Jared has been a part of Great Oaks Camp since 1992! Typically, when Jared works at camp, he stays with Graham in the camp apartment. However, Graham is getting married, so that will no longer be an option for Jared. - \$2,000-We would love to host a Winter Retreat for some of our at-risk campers. In order to do that, we have to cover the cost of supplies and food.
